GRAND PRIX (1966)

Grand Prix is a 1966 film that marries a classic love story with ahead-of-its-time racing cinematography. Directed by John Frankenheimer, the action movie is filled with actual racing footage and features cameo appearances by Formula 1 World Champions Phil Hill, Graham Hill, Juan Manuel Fangio, Jim Clark, Jochen Rindt and Jack Brabham as well as celebrities James Garner, Eva Marie Saint, and Jessica Walter.

Grand Prix won three Oscars at the 39th Academy Awards for Best Sound Effects, Best Film Editing and Best Sound and was also one of the ten highest-grossing films of 1966.

SENNA (2010)

Senna follows the riveting life of three-time Formula 1 Champion Ayrton Senna. Spanning the Brazilian's decade in Formula 1 from his debut at the 1984 Brazilian Grand Prix to his tragic death at San Marino in 1994, the documentary features archived race videos as well as private footage from the Senna family.

Senna brings to light the struggles and politics on and off the Formula 1 track and highlights Senna's rivalry with four-time Formula 1 Champion Alain Prost.

Now in the 20th anniversary of Senna's death, this critically acclaimed film has won awards at British Academy of Film and Television Arts (BAFTA) as well as the Sundance, Los Angeles, Melbourne and Adelaide film festivals.
